# The Musical Freestyle

Dressage had been rumored to be on the Olympic
chopping block in times past, though the International
Olympic Committee has already confirmed the event for the
2024 games. Robert Dover says "The sport over many years
found itself a bit in trouble . . . . People said, 'It's sort of like
watching paint dry.' "So the dressage governing body decided to add
an event set to music.

The Freestyle made an Olympic debut in 1996 and now has become so popular with audiences and advertisers that since the London

days, renegade riders are asking horses used to trotting to Tchaikovsky to body-pop to Beyoncé.

As you watch your friends at local shows, the World Cup and the Olympics this year, you may wonder how the judges determine the score for the freestyles. How are harmony, choreography, degree of difficulty, music, and interpretation

factored into the score?

Did you know that music is not scored on the likes or dislikes of the judge, but on a very specific set of criteria? The music score equates to everything that happens before the show in terms of

Olympics in 2012, the freestyle alone determines the individual medals. And for the first time at next year's Tokyo Olympics, a second of the three Olympic dressage events will include music: the Grand Prix Special, which helps determine the team medals. All combinations will ride the same routine, or test, but riders will select

their own accompanying music, which won't be judged, but

make the event more entertaining for viewers.

Fast forward to Wellington, Florida Friday Night Lights events. The speakers boomed with the familiar lyrics of Journey, and the crowd roared in jubilation: "Don't stop believing... hold on to that feeling!" The audience of about 1,400 wasn't cheering a band, but an exquisitely polished black gelding named Danilo as he pranced across the arena set to a medley of a cappella harmonies that resembled a routine on the television series 'Glee.' "I took a risk with that music," said Danilo's rider, Shelly Francis. "Now people think it's wicked cool." These

Choreography is a coefficient of 4. Design cohesiveness, use of the arena, balance and creativity all affect the choreography

Design cohesiveness is the main criteria in assessing the choreography score. When clarity is established throughout the freestyle, the base score for choreography is 7.0.

After the CDS member luncheon on January 11 2020, CDS members may be silent auditors as Olympic judge Janet Foy and Terry Gallo teach licensed judges and L graduates the methodology of judging freestyles. On January 12 at Murieta Equestrian Center, Terry will use demonstration riders to show when music is suitable for the gaits. Then Janet Foy will judge demonstration freestyles. You may even consider riding a freestyle. Freestyles can be performed at training through fourth levels, Intermediaire and Grand Prix.
